




Offering your services, knowledge, and/or abilities freely to help an organization or individual(s)

Components needed to ensure your skills-based volunteering counts as relevant experience



- 6. Document your project




Project Plan Components

- 6. Submit plan








Why I Think Volunteering is Important Now


- You practice your skills

Hiring Managers and HR Executives Value Volunteerism




consider volunteer work equal to full-time work experience

Why Volunteering is Important When You Have a job


- You can meet people, build your network




