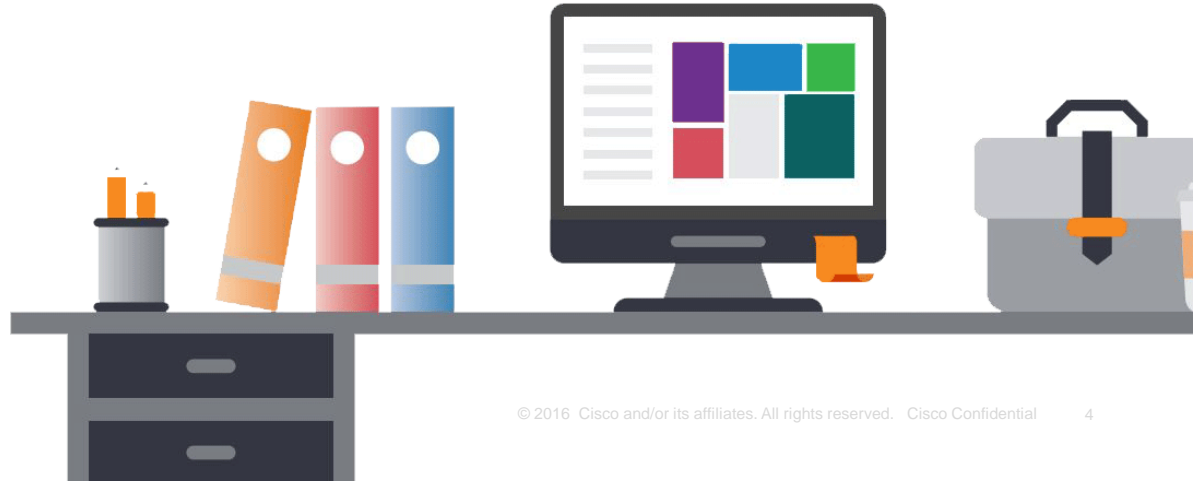

Fundamentals of Professional Etiquette

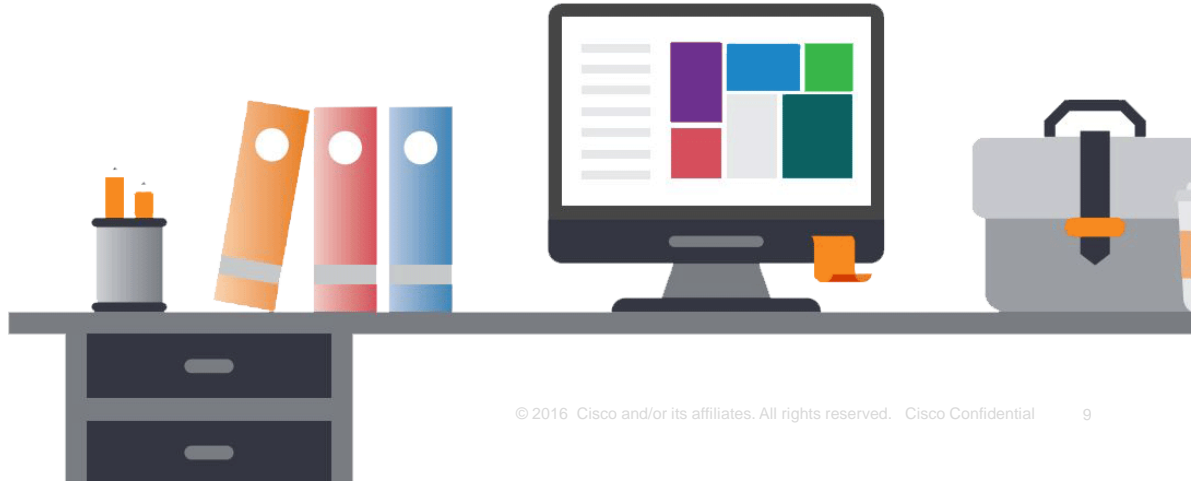


Actively Improve Your Etiquette
